## Mission Feedback — Mexicali

Excerpts from a report submitted by Paula Mihok, Central Whidbey Lions Club

Working together for 40 years, Rotarians and Lions Clubs have been serving the community of Mexicali. "Joining Forces" is not a new concept to our clubs! Teams providing construction and medical services... at the same time, allowing every volunteer to participate fully with the skill set they have to offer. The original core of volunteers now extends to their families, children, and grandchildren!



This year was OUTSTANDING! Used playground equipment was recycled from Whidbey Island through the Central Whidbey Lions, with the support of the Sunrise Escondido Rotary. 400 pair of eyeglasses and cases were provided by the Northwest Lions Eyeglass Recycling Center. Transportation expenses, medical supplies, construction, paint, sports equipment, and toys were also donated from individuals, corporations, and clubs. If that wasn't enough, Beta testing a diagnostic tool for amblyopia (lazy eye") was also conducted.

This year is our Centennial Celebration for Lions Clubs International. We were fortunate that our project included recycling on an international scale, as well as vision and other health services. Patients of all ages were provided vision, dental, podiatric, energy medicine and acutonics care, as well as veterinary services.

Spring Break for the school started 2 weeks prior to the service project. The school rooms and courtyard provided areas for the medical teams to work. An empty field next to the courtyard was surveyed and prepared for the playground equipment.





Our hosts, the Calafia Rotary of Mexicali, provided countless hours of equipment restoration. Their generous support of additional medical services, transportation, a cement mixer, meals and refreshments throughout the weekend made it possible.



A local Cub Scout Troop and Calafia Rotary families also provided labor and translation services.

The outpouring of service was amazing!
